**Alliance Theatre Celebrates 20 Years of Holiday Tradition With the
Broadway-Scale Favorite *A Christmas Carol***

ATLANTA — Scrooge is back in the Alliance's annual holiday gift to Atlanta! Now in its 20th year, ***A Christmas Carol*** has become a holiday season tradition for generations of families throughout the Southeast. Atlanta's own Rosemary Newcott, the Sally G. Tomlinson Artistic Director of Theatre for Youth, again directs this lavish musical complete with holiday music and jaw-dropping special effects. Chris Kayser returns for his 17th season in a definitive portrayal of Ebenezer Scrooge, setting a not-to-be-missed standard of excellence. This Broadway-scale musical spectacular, filled with soaring holiday music, is set in a vast Victorian warehouse where a stone-hearted Ebenezer Scrooge learns the meaning of compassion as he travels the road to redemption from his lonely, miserly life. Renowned director David H. Bell adapted this 1840s tale into a musical featuring favorite holiday carols and hymns.

Royce Mann returns to the role of Tiny Tim this year. Additionally, Atlanta's rich diversity is reflected in the casting as Neal A. Ghant returns as Bob Cratchit, Je Nie Flemming reprises her role as Mrs. Cratchit and Bernardine Mitchell is back in the dual roles of Mrs. Dilber and Mrs. Fezziwig.
