Required Materials. Please submit:

- 1. One electronic copy of all application materials and work samples to Celise Kalke (celise.kalke@alliancetheatre.org)
- 2. Five hard copies (3 hole-punched) of all application materials and work samples (digital only work samples are acceptable for work that isn't a script). Please bind materials with binder clips or inside 3 ring binders.

Notes on submission materials:

Work samples may not exceed 10 typed pages or 5 minutes of digital or recorded media.

You may submit electronic copies of completed works for judges to look at but they will only be forwarded to judges if the judge requests more work after seeing the original excerpted work sample.

Please do not submit materials that need to be returned to you, or are originals.

If you are dropping the application off in person, you may leave them at the Woodruff Arts Center concierge desk in the Memorial Arts Building Galleria or in the drop box in front of the "Old" Education Suite on the 3rd floor of the Memorial Arts Building (1280 Peachtree Street NE). Because of a change in security rules, it will not be possible to drop off materials at the 4th floor Alliance offices.
